# The Details

- The program runs from May 28<sup>th</sup> through July 10<sup>th</sup>.
- 9 Credit hours from a range of subject areas and levels are offered.
- A \$500 deposit is due by December 15, 2009. After that date you will be charged a **\$100 late fee**.
- Total registration and fees before December 15<sup>th</sup> are \$5900, and \$6000 after.
- Installment payments in the amount of 1/3 of your remaining balance will be due February 15<sup>th</sup>, March 15<sup>th</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup>.
- The balance of all program costs are due by **April 15, 2010**
- Program costs include: room and 2/3 board, tuition, insurance, museums, entrance fees, field trips, and public transportation passes. **Airfare is not included** and must be purchased by the student.
- Costs **do not include** such items as: airfare to Paris, passport fees, ISIC card, Eurail pass, laundry, telephone and internet costs, lodging while traveling, meals other than those specified, and items of a personal nature.
- We strongly recommend the purchase of trip cancellation insurance in case of emergencies.
- We strongly recommend that you meet with your advisor to make sure that the courses you select will be useful within your curriculum.
- Not all classes will meet minimum enrollment requirements so you are strongly encouraged to sign up for 4 courses.
- In order to participate in any program, students must be in good academic standing with the University, and not on academic suspension.
- Students pursuing a degree at UL Lafayette are allowed to take a maximum of 6 hours of Humanities (HUMN) credit at the 200 level, 6 hours at the 300 level and 6 hours at the 400 level. Any additional HUMN credits earned will not be applied toward your degree.
- Scholarships are available for current UL students with a GPA of 2.8 or better. Apply at the study abroad office before February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2010. Financial needs are considered.
